

### TASK 1 READING

#### Air pollution causes 'huge' reduction in intelligence

Air pollution causes a "huge" reduction in intelligence, according to new research, <u>demonstrating</u> that the damage of toxic air to society is far deeper than the well-known impacts on physical health.


The research was conducted in China but is important across the world, with 95% of the global population breathing unsafe air. It found that high pollution levels led to <u>significant</u> drops in test scores in language and mathematics, with the average effect equivalent to having lost a year of the person's education. "Polluted air can cause everyone to reduce their level of education by one year, which is huge," said Xi Chen at Yale School of Public Health in the US. "But we know the effect is worse for the elderly, especially those over 64, and for men, and for those with low education. If we calculate [the loss] for them, it may be a few years of education."

The new work analysed language and arithmetic tests <u>conducted</u> as part of the China Family Panel Studies on 20,000 people across the nation between 2010 and 2014. The scientists compared the test results with records of nitrogen dioxide and sulphur dioxide pollution. They found the longer people were exposed to dirty air, the bigger the damage to intelligence, with language ability more harmed than mathematical ability and men more <u>harmed</u> than women. The researchers said this may result from differences in how male and female brains work.

"But there is no shortcut to solve this issue," he said. "Governments really need to take concrete measures to reduce air pollution. That may benefit human capital, which is one of the most important driving forces of economic growth." In China, air pollution is declining but remains three times above World Health Organisation (WHO) limits. According to the WHO, 20 of the world's most polluted cities are in developing countries. China, home to several of those cities, has been engaged in a "war against pollution" for the past five years.

The results would apply around the world, Chen added. The damage to intelligence was likely to be accumulative, he said, with a 1mg rise in pollution over three years equivalent to losing more than a month of education. Small pollution particles are known to be especially damaging. "That is the same wherever you live. As human beings we have more in common than is different."






